U.S. Department of Education Guidelines

First-generation:

An individual, neither of whose parents *completed* a baccalaureate/bachelor's degree (typically 4-year undergraduate degree);

or

An individual who, prior to the age of 18, regularly resided with and received support from only one parent and whose supporting parent did not complete a baccalaureate/bachelor's degree.

If your parent(s) and/or guardian(s) attended college but do not have a bachelor's degree (i.e., did not graduate), you are considered to be first-generation.
